Benjamin Brindley Cheesemonger Market Place Derby My Grandfather (business established 1796). Died in his chair Was buried in All Saints Churchyard.

John Brindley son of the above, my uncle died in a railway carriage between Normanton and York - buried in family vault at Spondon.

William Brindley my father died on the W.C. at Saint Alkmunds Churchyard was buried in family vault at Spondon.

John Brindley my brother was found drowned in the Thames at Greenwich and was buried in Greenwich churchyard.

Benjamin Brindley, my brother died suddenly on the couch and was buried in family vault at Spondon.

William Brindley son of the above, my nephew was found drowned in the Thames (mysterious) was missed for a month and buried at Richmond.

William Henry Brindley died after a short illness in bed and the only one who did so, was buried at the Old Cemetery Uttoxeter New Road November 8 1896.

Ann Brindley died of consumption was buried at All Saints in Vault.

Adelaide died of consumption and was buried in family vault at Spondon

Charlotte Brindley my grandmother was Blind for upwards of twenty years was buried in Family Vault at Spondon

Mary Brindley, my aunt died at Spondon and was buried in the family vault.

Mary Brindley, my mother(maiden name Mary Thickett) died April 24th 1883 was buried at Spondon in Vault.
